It is always with great pride that I write the opening remarks for the annual Donor Report; both pride in this College and its numerous achievements, but also pride in you, our alumni and friends, for your generosity in enabling all of this important work.

Our Christ's community is such a strong one, as I am reminded every year in the Telephone Campaign, when you as alumni get the chance to talk directly to our students. Last year, you helped us raise a record breaking £302,750, which contributed to every aspect of our Student Support Initiative; enabling us to support even more students throughout their time at Christ's. The impact of this is immeasurable, but I hope the testimony of our students later in this report goes some way to demonstrating how life-changing this funding is.

The Campaign also shows how far our community stretches, as calls are made all across the world, and I hear of conversation after conversation where, despite all this time and distance, there is a fondness of memory for the College. This is illustrated by the annual Chapel choir tours, with friendly Christ's faces wherever our choir travels, offering support every step of the way. During last year's trip to Canada, our students received a warm welcome in venues from Montreal to Kingston and Niagara. I hope just as many of you will be able to see the choir in their tour of Singapore and New Zealand this summer.

This broad base community is constantly expanding, thanks to the range of EU and overseas bursaries we now offer, helping us to attract the best and

brightest from across the globe. Exemplifying this was our inaugural International Awards Ceremony in November, which celebrated sixteen students from across ten countries, here at Christ's because of the generous financial support that you provide for these programmes.

The uniting experience for all our varied alumni, no matter where they come from, and wherever they go on to from here, is their first journey through the Great Gate into First Court, a journey that has been repeated for over 500 years. Now restored to its sixteenth-century vibrancy, with the completion of our four-year restoration programme, new and old matriculands can truly experience the sensation of walking in our ancestor's footsteps, and carrying on the traditions of this great College.

I hope that you too find time to visit Cambridge again, and pass under Lady Margaret's careful watch, so that you can see in person the impact that all of your generosity is having on Christ's.

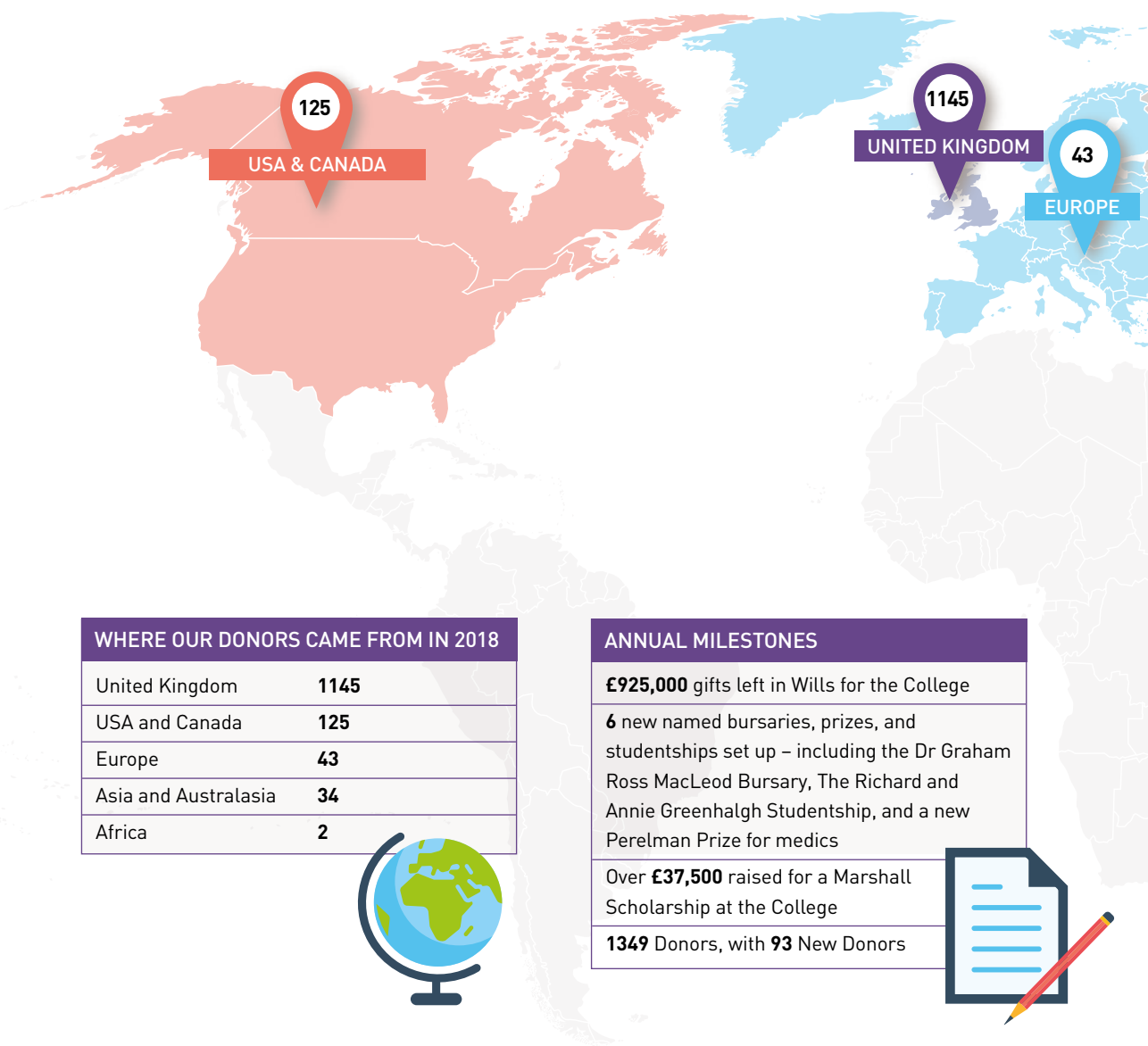

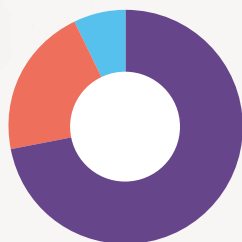

COMPLETING THE GREAT GATE RENOVATION – £415,000

One of the most dramatic changes to Christ's in recent months has been the complete renovation of the College's Great Gate, after a four-year programme of work to restore the Gatehouse to its original splendour.

This included research into the correct colours to use, restoration of damaged stonework, as well as the painting work itself, which led to scaffolding outside the front of College for three months over the summer.

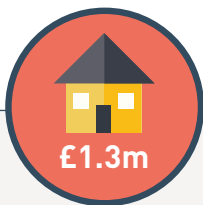
Alongside this, the stonework above the Master's Lodge, the heraldic animals near Hall, and metalwork on the gates to the Fellows' Garden were also repainted, in order to conserve these vital aspects of our heritage for future generations.

Work on this prestigious part of the college's, and Cambridge's, culture, was only possible thanks to generous donations to our Buildings Fund and endowment.

PURCHASING HAMIED VILLA **£1.3 million**

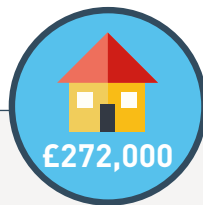
Thanks to a generous gift from Dr Yusuf Hamied we have been able to purchase 8 Victoria Street to use as accommodation for our graduate students. Located a short distance from the College, this purchase has gone a long way to expanding the property we own near Christ's, and increasing the high-quality lodging we are able to offer.

Excellent graduate accommodation, in the vicinity of the College, is a major priority for our Campaign; helping our graduates engage with the wider Christ's community, both for their academic benefit and their own personal development.

Renovation work will now take place to convert the eight-bedroom property, and we look forward to showing you the results of this in the future.

THE BLYTH BUILDING UPGRADES **£272,000**

Over the Summer Vacation, beds and fittings were regularly seen being moved across Third Court, in order to revamp the accommodation before students returned for the Michaelmas term. This important work ensured that the bathrooms in this block were up to the standard of the rest of College, improved the Gyp Rooms, and maintained the ceilings; all part of our programme of improvements across Christ's.

These upgrades to the student experience in College are important for ensuring that Christ's remains an ideal environment to live, work, and study in, whilst also being affordable for our students.

THE BINDESH P. SHAH STUDENTSHIP FOR AN MPhil IN ECONOMICS £18,000 a year

Established in 2016, the Bindesh P. Shah Studentship annually supports an exceptional candidate on an Economics-related Master's programme. Further gifts received at the end of 2018, and early 2019, have guaranteed this Studentship for at least five more academic years, thanks to Mr Shah's generosity.

Since establishing the new Research Fellowship and Teaching Officer post in Economics – in collaboration with the Faculty of Economics and the support of our Teaching Funds – ensuring strong Economics applications to Christ's has become even more important. Such scholarships and teaching posts ensure that Christ's remains at the forefront of academic research, and the calibre of student attracted by the Bindesh P. Shah Studentship is an essential part of this.

Rachel Lovitt, the 2018 recipient, originally studied at York. She says

'Without the Bindesh P Shah Studentship, I would not have been able to accept my offer to study at Christ's College. It has allowed me enjoy my time at Cambridge and take advantage of opportunities that I otherwise wouldn't have had access to, such as attending talks by influential economists, and experiencing formal hall in many of the colleges. Simply, it has enabled me to have the full Cambridge experience.'

OUR STUDENT SUPPORT Initiative

DEVELOPED FROM TWO OF THE MAIN PILLARS OF OUR 'CAMPAIGN FOR CHRIST'S' – 'ATTRACTING THE BEST' AND 'ENHANCING COLLEGE LIFE' – OUR STUDENT SUPPORT INITIATIVE REMAINS ONE OF THE MAJOR FOCI IN OUR ANNUAL FUNDRAISING.

This overarching programme funds: bursaries and studentships for graduates and undergraduates who need them; the outreach work that encourages applications from diverse backgrounds to Christ's; as well as hardship and welfare support to help students thrive regardless of their situation. It also contributes to the various additional elements that enrich our students' time at Cambridge, such as travel to expand their subject knowledge, or grants for sport and other extracurricular activities.

The impact that this programme has can be clearly seen in our position at the top of the Tompkins table of Cambridge Colleges; but the reports from our students on how much this support means to them is equally enlightening about how vital your generous donations to these funds have been.

- **Stephan Stephanides**, PhD student in Classics – 'When I arrived in Cambridge last October for the MPhil in Classics, I instantly felt at home. I really enjoyed being part of the academic community here, and I was encouraged to apply for the PhD by my supervisor. I did not anticipate getting any funding, but I was thrilled when I was awarded the studentship. It goes without saying that this will allow me to continue my passion for academia and Classics.'
- **Johanna Finnemann**, PhD student in Experimental Psychology, was given a research grant to attend the 'International Society for Autism Research annual meeting' – 'Without the assistance of the grant I might not have been able to go as I am self-funded... Aside from a few email conversations with others who were interested in the presentation I gave, I have now also met up with another scientist to collaborate on a paper and we have already started the data analysis for our joint project.'
- **Charlotte Fraser**, Third Year English student, received a travel grant to visit the 'MS Paris of Julian of Norwich's *Revelation of Divine Love* at the Bibliothèque nationale de France' – 'I was able to make many valuable observations that I would not have been aware of had I not visited the manuscript in person', especially compared with the MS Sloane she had previously seen in the British Library, 'and seeing both manuscripts in person has invigorated my research for my upcoming dissertation.'
- **Enrico Fontana**, MAsT candidate in Applied Mathematics – 'receiving the honour of a studentship for academic merit has had an enormously encouraging impact on my attitude. The fact that my past efforts have been recognised motivates me to continue on the path of academia with renewed determination... I am extremely grateful.'

The 2018 Chapel Choir Tour

Every year, the Chapel Choir goes on a summer tour abroad during the Vacation, taking their music across the globe to entertain alumni and local audiences. The 2018 tour's destination was Canada, with our choir travelling across the country to perform in chapels, cathedrals, and churches, in multiple sold out concerts.

These tours are subsidised by the College, and are a great way to provide our students with an opportunity to see more of the world, whilst experiencing and performing a wide range of music in fantastic venues.

Simon Fraser, one of the two organisers for the tour of Canada, said 'the Choir is very grateful to College for the generous travel grant we received; this support helps to keep our tours affordable for all our members, and it provides a way for us to be able to travel to places that might be unaffordable for many... we also hope that by maintaining a professional standard of performances abroad, we can enhance the College's reputation as a successful musical, as well as academic, institution.'

The George Spyrou LLM Scholarship

Named in memory of George Spyrou, who came to Christ's in the 1970s, the Scholarship is worth up to £15,000 for a student to read for an LLM. As a scholar at the College, they receive the opportunity to dine at High Table for College Feasts, and get priority access to central Cambridge accommodation- enhancing their Christ's experience throughout their course.

The current award recipient is Nikola Klímová, who joined us from Charles University in Prague, and has an interest in Human Rights Law that she is pursuing at Christ's. The difference that this award can make is illustrated in the final report of the 2017-18 scholar, Ranjini Das, who had originally been accepted for the LLM in 2014, but had been unable to take up the place due to 'financial constraints'. Indeed, she writes, 'had it not been for the grant of the Spyrou endowment... reading law at Cambridge would have perhaps never been a reality for me', and the award allowed her to have 'a tremendously enriching and fulfilling experience' on the course.

Alongside the award, an annual dinner is held in College; to congratulate recipients, and develop this network of bright young legal minds. This year was the first time that every recipient of the award since its inception was able to attend, allowing them to all meet each other, and discuss where they are in their respective careers. We look forward to this network continuing to change the lives of these, and future, Spyrou Scholars.

SPOTLIGHT ON Access

THE ADMISSIONS DEPARTMENT IS FOCUSED ON DEVELOPING NEW INITIATIVES, IN ORDER TO INCREASE THE NUMBER OF POTENTIAL STUDENTS THAT THE COLLEGE REACHES, ENCOURAGE THEM TO APPLY TO CHRIST'S, AND MAXIMISE THEIR CHANCES OF ACCEPTANCE.

For 2018, a major initiative was a collaborative programme with the charity Project Access, aimed at offer-holders from disadvantaged backgrounds, who run a disproportionate risk of missing their offer conditions. We worked with Project Access on an online academic mentoring scheme for nominated offer-holders, which included peer-to-peer guidance from current students, and access to a wide range of resources such as past A-level papers and revision aids. Once Christ's had set up the scheme, we encouraged other Colleges to participate and ten did so. Training for all mentors took place at Christ's, and these current students kept in regular contact with their mentees throughout the year, until A-level results came out. A lot has been learned from this pilot, and we are excited to continue it in the coming years.

Neither this new project, nor our existing programmes, would be possible without the support we receive from our alumni and we are so grateful for all the outreach work your gifts enable.
