Christ's celebrated the 40th Anniversary of Women this past year, and it was a delight to preside over this time in College. One of the highlights of events for me was the Panel Discussion and Dinner held in June, involving alumnae who came to talk about the impact Christ's women have had since graduating.

It was a truly inspiring occasion, meeting so many alumnae and hearing what they did at Christ's, and how they have contributed to the world beyond it, be that through their work and volunteering, or through supporting others and raising the next generation. It also reminded me of how much has been achieved at the College, and yet how much more is accomplished every day.

Christ's student body is a very active one, and passionate about the College, as shown by the number of them that take part in our annual Telephone Campaign, or the Outreach events held during the Vacations. Their involvement in every aspect of Cambridge life allows them to make a real difference during their time at Christ's. Achievements vary from sphere to sphere: Yasmin Reid-Linfoot received an upReach Ten Award for her work with Project Access in inspiring students from non-traditional backgrounds; Henry Morley and Laragh Harvey-Kelly sailed on the Cambridge Black team which finished 7th in the BUSA National Universities Championship; MPhil student Tom Sampson received prizes from both the German History and Cambridge Historical Societies for his undergraduate dissertation. However, they all share in common our students' desire to excel, and their ability to reach new heights, thanks to the support your donations provide them.

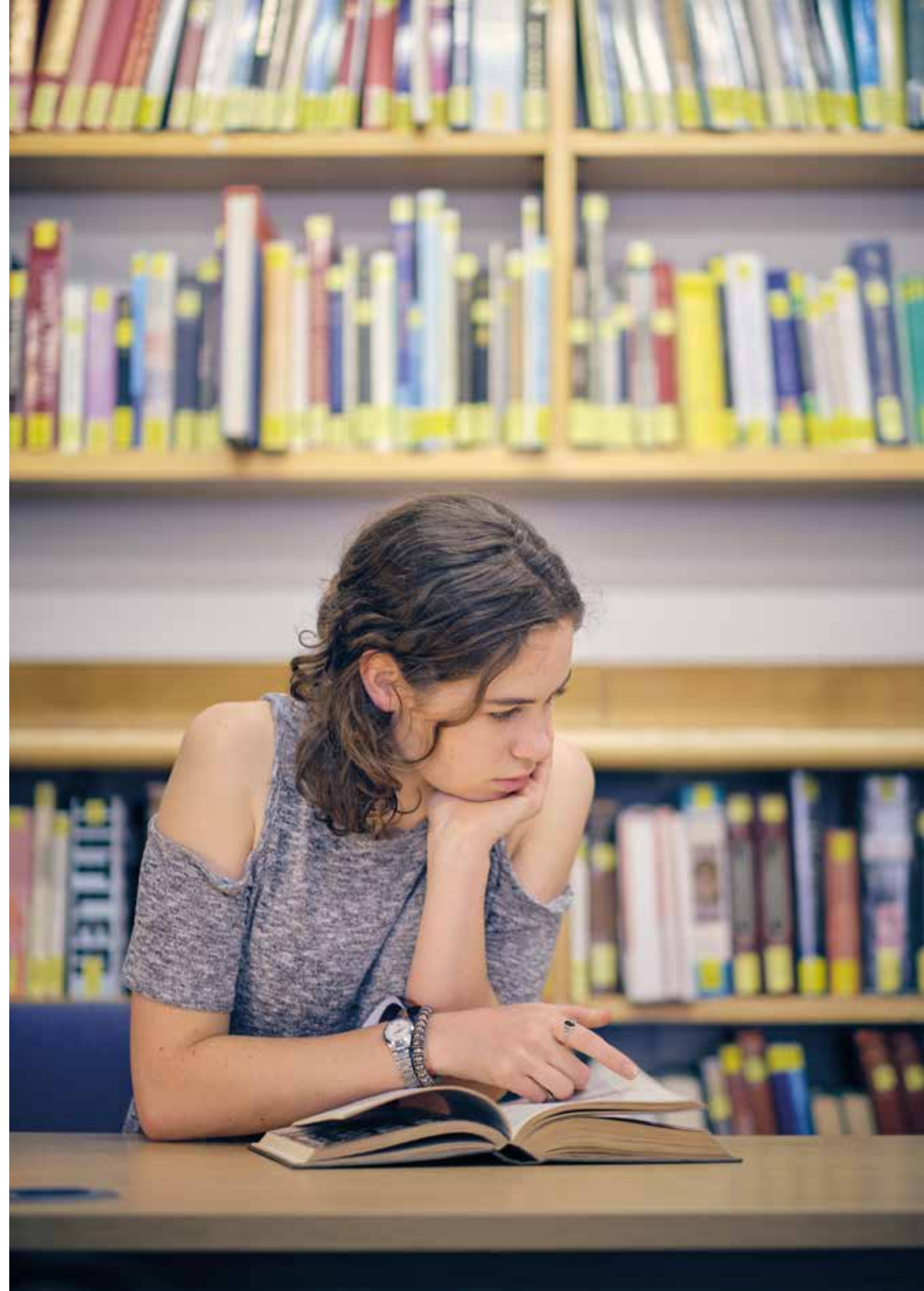
Indeed, 2019 was a year of firsts here at Christ's – not least in our position at the Tompkins Table, first for the second year in a row, and with the highest proportion of women receiving firsts from any College since the University's foundation. We had

the first Christ's Arts Society and Fellows workshop to discuss the re-hanging of portraits in Hall, the first *Teach First* Residential, co-hosted with King's in April, and even the first 'Feminist Cabaret' from the College's Feminist Society. This year even saw the first appearances of the new 'College Fox' – although Rocket, our College cat, likely hopes that this is a first that won't be repeated!

Alongside all these firsts, a number of our longer-term projects began to reach fruition; with planning permission having been at last obtained for the Fourth Court, another of our Campaign priorities is moving forward apace, and we look forward to starting building work. Meanwhile, our long-term tradition of hosting Marshall Scholars at the College has been enhanced by a new partnership with the Marshall Foundation, meaning there will now be a Christ's specific Scholarship offered to American postgraduates. All in all, the future is looking very bright.

In every way, the College is breaking new ground, something that is only possible through your generous support. And of course, in these exceptionally challenging times as we all confront the COVID-19 pandemic, your loyalty to Christ's is more important than ever. I look forward to writing next year, on how Christ's and its students have thrived despite uncertainty; but for now, I am sure you will enjoy learning about all that has gone on at Christ's in this past year.

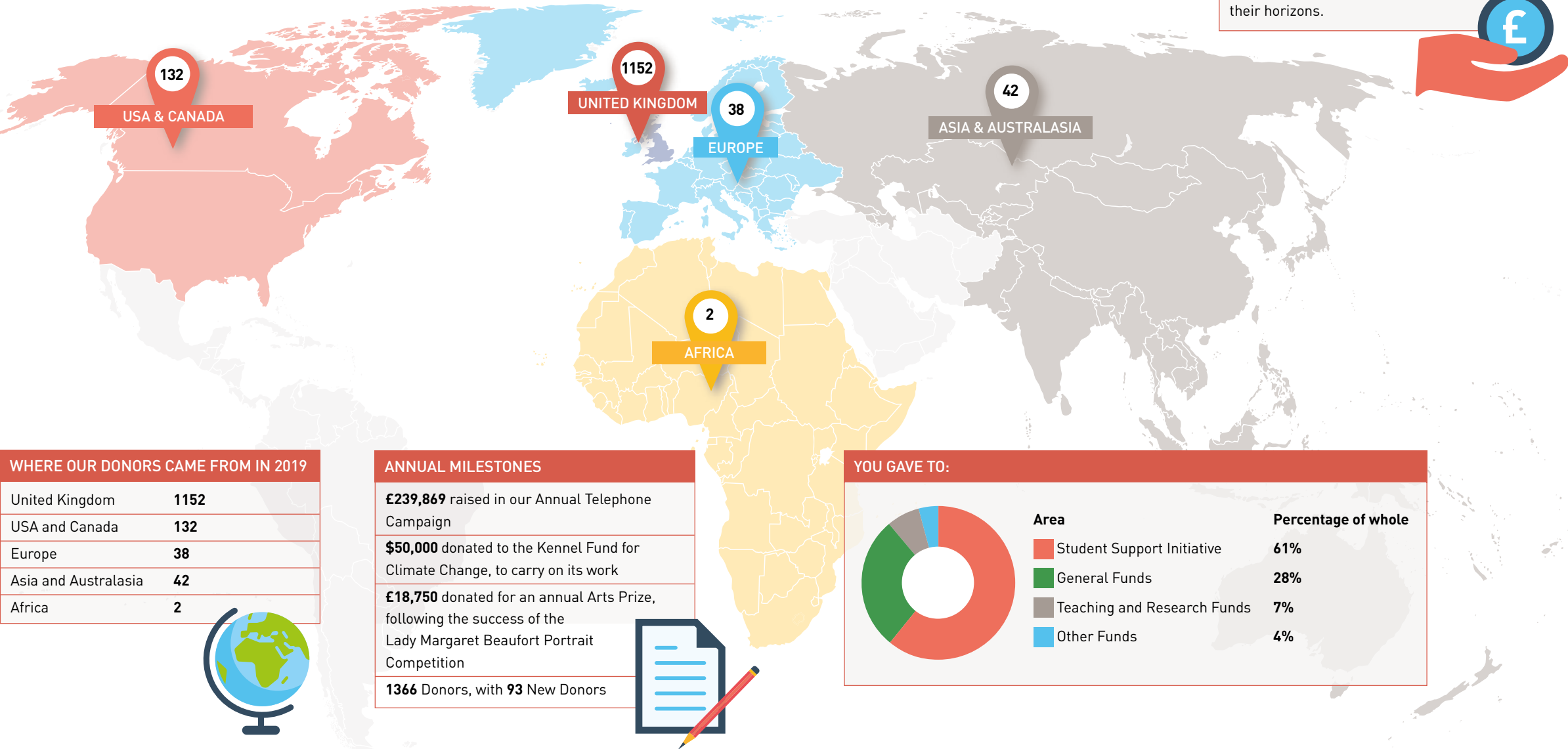

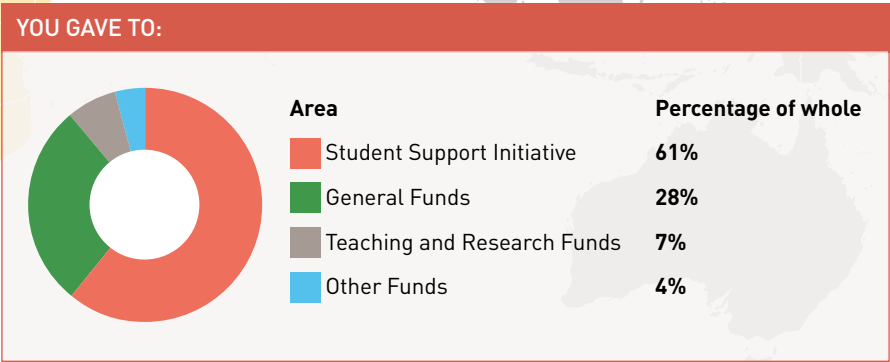

CAMPAIGN Progress

THE CAMPAIGN FOR CHRIST'S

THE CAMPAIGN FOR CHRIST'S AIMS TO RAISE FUNDS UNDER FOUR BROAD HEADINGS: ATTRACTING THE BEST, ACADEMIC EXCELLENCE, SHAPING THE FUTURE, AND ENHANCING COLLEGE LIFE.

We are approaching £30m raised so far, and have been able to provide additional financial support to undergraduate and postgraduate students, fund new access initiatives, appoint a number of new Fellows, and ensure that students have the opportunity to participate in a wide range of extra-curricular activities.

We are delighted that of the three capital projects identified as priorities for the Campaign, one is complete, and we are starting work on another. The Boathouse has been up-and-running for a couple of years now, and is an outstanding facility for our students. We are thrilled that planning permission

has been granted for the new accommodation building on the main site, and we will be able to accommodate an additional 64 students, enabling them to participate fully in the life of the College. We have raised over £5.5m towards this exciting project so far, and the major work is due to start in the summer.

The final capital project is CRASH (Christ's Research and Study Hub), which will provide a much-needed focal point for College life, containing the library, a research and study space, and a new covered courtyard café, and we will be focusing attention on fundraising for this.

THE MARSHALL SCHOLARSHIP PARTNERSHIP £23,361 for 2019–20 Academic Year

Something that might be familiar already to our American alumni is our new partnership with the Marshall Commission. Christ's has welcomed intellectually distinguished graduates from the USA as Marshall Scholars for years; however, this new scholarship is Christ's specific, and will be part funded by both us, and the Marshall Commission.

This 'fee-waiver' scholarship is offered to a student for two to three years, dependent on the length of the course, and includes a number of book, thesis, and research grants, as well as a travel allowance, to make the most of their education in the UK. It is valid for any field of study, and gives a student the opportunity to immerse themselves both in British education and also British culture.

Our first Scholar through this partnership is **Jack Brake**, who has joined us from the University of

Virginia, followed by Tsinghua University in Beijing. He is studying for a PhD in Politics and International Studies, based on the concept of prestige in international politics, and has also found time to join the Choir, and row on the River Cam in the Boat Club. He says:

"My Marshall Scholarship has given me lifelong friends, future colleagues, and countless sources of intellectual inspiration, and I am deeply grateful for the support I have received. I look forward to taking advantage of the wealth of opportunities at Christ's over the course of my three years, and to someday paying forward, as best I am able, the generosity from which I have benefited."

Over £45,000 has been raised towards this Scholarship so far, ensuring we can support Jack for his first two years; we look forward to developing and expanding this partnership into the future.



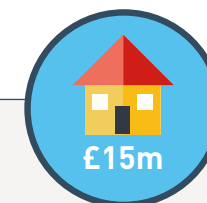
10TH ANNIVERSARY OF THE CHARLES DARWIN & GALÁPAGOS ISLANDS FUND £10,000 raised in 2019

The London Linnean Society was the venue for the 10th Anniversary Celebrations of Christ's College's partnership with the Galápagos Conservation Trust, which took place in October 2019. With talks from those who had received grants from the fund, the evening celebrated the difference this has made to research both at College, and on the Islands themselves.

It is also in 2019 that we said goodbye to **Mike Stock** (second from right below), who was the first Darwin and Galápagos Islands Fellow of the College. He says:

"The Charles Darwin and Galápagos Islands Fund gave me an invaluable stepping stone in my career. Not only did it give me the opportunity to prove myself as a young scientist, but I was able to develop an exciting research project in the Galápagos Islands, which would otherwise have been difficult to access and prohibitively expensive. I've continued this work since leaving Christ's, aiming to make a valuable contribution to wildlife and civil protection efforts in the archipelago."

This Fund, and its connected Research Fellowship, is entirely supported by alumni donations, and the College is grateful for the support that it receives, especially as we look to elect our second Fellow – we will keep you posted with updates.



FOURTH COURT DEVELOPMENT £15 million needed

The College has now received planning permission for the foundation of Fourth Court, and the King Street redevelopment, meaning that building work will begin going ahead for the project in the summer of 2020. With a total of over £5.5 million already raised, towards the £15 million needed to complete the project, our goal will be to reach this target, and ensure we can continue to meet our promise to house as many of our students as possible in affordable College accommodation.

This development, which will take the place of the shed by New Court, and connect to the Todd Building, will provide sixty-four new student rooms, four Fellows' rooms, and seven student kitchens. Alongside this, there will be space for a dedicated Music Room, and two additional Seminar Rooms, expanding the space for students to live, learn, and develop their skills within Christ's.



OUR STUDENT SUPPORT Initiative

THIS UMBRELLA FUND HAS GONE FROM STRENGTH TO STRENGTH IN 2019, CONTINUING TO IMPACT EVERY ASPECT OF THE STUDENT EXPERIENCE WHILST AT CHRIST'S – FROM RENT BURSARIES AND HARDSHIP GRANTS TO STUDENTS IN NEED, TO FUNDING STUDENT SOCIETIES, AND SUPRACURRICULAR ACTIVITIES BY OUR STUDENTS TO EXPAND THEIR ACADEMIC INTERESTS.

With the introduction of the Harding Challenge from August 2019, a university-wide undergraduate bursary fund that is unlocked, pound for pound, by new donors to collegiate Cambridge, we are hoping to report even greater successes next year. Each gift makes a real, personal difference to the life of the individual student it supports, enabling them to do things and be inspired in ways they didn't imagine before coming to Christ's, as can be seen from the Travel and Bursary Reports the College receives every year.

Ruby Clare, in her third year reading History of Art, undertook a travel itinerary of country houses with interior schemes created by Robert Adam, the intended topic of her third-year dissertation – 'My travel has allowed me to discover new decorative elements in properties that I would have been unable to see in photographs. I would like to thank the college for its generous grant, which has enabled me not only to create strong arguments for my dissertation, but also to provide me with knowledge about one of my favourite architects whom I wish to continue to study in postgraduate education.'

Sina Talachian, PhD Candidate for History and recipient of the Strachan Bursary – 'Aside from the research my stay in Cambridge, and Christ's College in particular, has taught me more about myself, and what it means to be devoted to the pursuit of a scholarly life. I am confident that had I not had the privilege of this experience, I would have been much the worse for it, both as a scholar and person.'

Joshua Meynell, Third Year Archaeology Student, undertook a five week internship at the Ludwig-Maximilians-Universität (LMU) in Munich, involving cataloguing and transcription of inscriptions onto online databases, as well as writing articles – 'This strengthened the already existing relationship between the Assyriology departments in Cambridge and LMU. It was a privilege to have had the opportunity to get to know and work very closely with a large number of leading Assyriological academics, and the thought of how much significant work in the Assyriological world happened in their office throughout my 5 week visit is stimulating. To have made even minor contributions to various Oracc and eBL projects was a privilege.'

Travel and the Environment

One of the major priorities of the JCR over 2019 has been the College's impact on the environment, and that concern is reflected in how our students have approached the way they have undertaken their trips, and even how they travelled during them.



Esme Cavendish (m. 2017), travelled to Spain in order to volunteer at an eco-project in the Galician countryside during the Summer, connected to her interest

in ecocriticism in literature and desire to develop her Spanish. During the time, she was involved in the renovation of stone buildings in the Galician countryside, to make them into sustainable properties. In her own words: 'due to my concern about the climate crisis, I did not want to fly to Spain: instead, I took a variety of trains and coaches across France and Spain to reach my destination'.



Meanwhile, **Rufus Jordana** (m. 2016) used his grant to attend a social ecology conference in Liège in September, the experience informing his current study on social theories

and movements, as well as inspiring him for a potential postgraduate course on the study of land enclosure. Regarding travel, Rufus writes 'I was pleased to be able to travel by coach and train rather than flying in order to minimize my carbon footprint for the journey'.

The 2019 Sports Awards

Every year, the College holds a ceremony for the winners of major sports awards. These awards enable them to afford the myriad of costs involved with competing at a University, or even higher, level.

The award ceremony not only celebrates achievement, but also helps show students the value Christ's places on such activities, and our support for their endeavours. Indeed, one recipient, Pippa Whittaker, who was a member of the University Women's Boat Club, stated 'it's a great feeling to race in the knowledge that you have the whole College supporting you'.

Other award recipients included Ioana Pietroi, (a caller for the 2019 Telephone Campaign) who was Team Captain for the University Women's Tennis Team, and James Vitali, who was part of the 2019 Blues Cricket Team.

Derek Wilson (m. 1985), University Director of Development for Sport, Clubs & Societies, and the donor of a Sports Award was present at the ceremony, and says:

"Academic and sporting excellence often go hand in hand, and participation in sport enables students to develop and exhibit a wide variety of skills and has a vital role to play in the full educational experience of every student. No student should be deterred from participating in sporting activities for financial or other reasons."



SPOTLIGHT ON Access

WE HAVE NOW MADE MOST OF OUR UNDERGRADUATE OFFERS FOR 2020, AND WOULD LIKE TO SHARE WITH YOU SOME OF THE HIGHLIGHTS FROM THE MICHAELMAS TERM INTERVIEW SEASON, DEMONSTRATING THE IMPACT OF OUR OUTREACH WORK.

Following on from a rise in applications from women in 2018-19, to a historic high of fifty percent, this year saw the number continue to hold steady, with forty-eight percent of direct applications coming from female students. This figure is echoed in the applicant offers, with provisionally similar levels going to female applicants, as last year.

The number of offers given to students from disadvantaged backgrounds has also been encouraging, as we are above the University average for state school offers, with similar increases above Cambridge averages in offers to students flagged as coming from areas with socio-economic disadvantages.

Having run residential targeted at women, as well as students from Low Participation Neighbourhoods, for the past few years, we are delighted to see the results of our efforts, with more applications from students from these backgrounds. Thanks again to all of our donors, both large and small, without whom these successes would not be possible.

Post Offer Support

Continuing from the previous successes of the Project Access inter-collegiate offer-holder mentoring scheme, ten new direct applicant offer-holders, and three open offer-holders, have been nominated for mentoring. The College continues to coordinate the scheme, and we hope it continues to be successful.

Alongside this, we have expanded the support we can offer via the introduction of specialist support sessions for offer-holders who need to sit STEP examinations as part of their offer, but whose schools cannot support them. Three students this year have been put forward for this tutoring, kindly led by a Christ's alumnus, and we look forward to seeing the results of their efforts.
