FROM THE MASTER



This is the last preface for the Donor Report that I will be writing. For the past six years, it has been a pleasure to honour the difference your giving has made to the special community that is Christ's, and to describe to you some of the resultant enrichment I have seen in the lives of our students.

Of course, the past few years have seen us face a range of challenges, even before the difficulties of COVID. The College has looked towards both its past, undertaking research into the legacies of enslavement, and its future, facing questions on divestment and our role in the climate crisis. These are challenging topics, but also important ones for Christ's to grapple with for the sake of our next steps as an institution.

Despite such challenges, these have also been times of great achievement and celebration for our College: two capital projects, in the form of the Blyth-McGregor Boathouse, and Yusuf Hamied Court; the 40th Anniversary of Women at Christ's; and being first in the Tompkins table for four years in a row, to name just a few. The world-leading research our Fellows engage in has continued apace, with recent high accolades received by Dr Daniel Field, Professor Susan Bayly, and Dame Theresa Marteau to name just a few – and this expertise has passed down through the teaching of our students to enrich profoundly their intellectual journey. Finally, for me, nothing will be more memorable than how, in the depths of the pandemic, the whole Christ's community – the staff, Fellows, students, and alumni, even far overseas – pulled together so impressively to bolster the well-being of every member of our community. It will be my recollections of this inspiring solidarity in adversity that will be my fondest of this great institution.

By the end of this Summer I will have presided over a number of cohorts of students for the entirety of their time here, from their arrival as Freshers, to their steps onto the lawns of First Court as graduands. From this, I have seen that, no matter how short a time a student spends here, the impact this College has on the rest of their lives is transformational. I have seen this in the students who have talked to me about their future plans, and the ideas that Christ's has sparked in them. I have seen this at alumni events, where I have had the privilege of meeting so many of you in person, and hearing how your time here shaped your future studies and careers. I have even seen it in the prospective applicants whom I have taught at our Outreach events, and the way that our Admissions team inspires them to dream bigger than they could possibly have imagined before.

From next year, my successor as Master, Lord McDonald will be the one to address you in these publications; so let me say, for the final time, thank you for all the generosity and loyalty you have shown. Not just for your support this year, but for that provided throughout my entire six-year term at the College. I will leave Christ's knowing that, thanks to all of you, its future is a very bright one indeed.

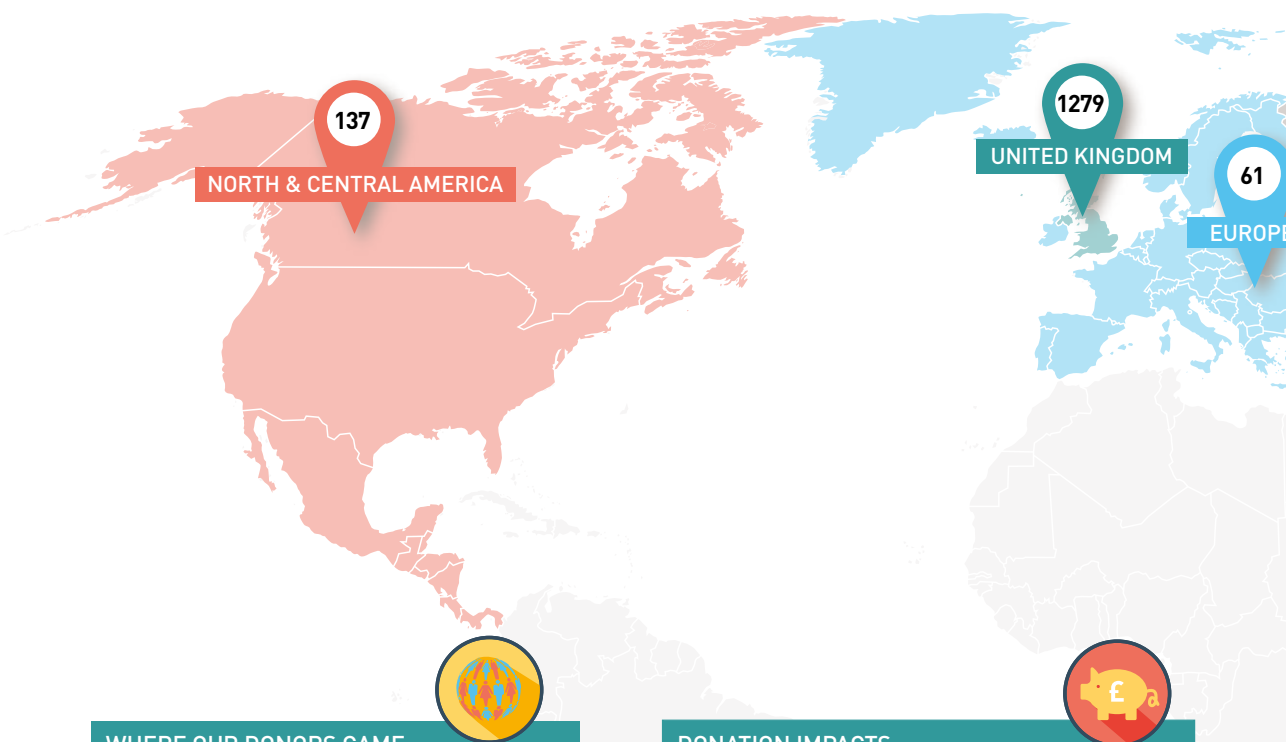

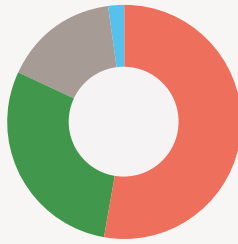

LIVING IN THE 'NEW NORMAL'

WE ARE DELIGHTED TO BE ABLE TO STATE THAT, THANKS TO THE GENEROSITY OF OUR ALUMNI AND SUPPORTERS, WE ARE NOW APPROACHING THE £50 MILLION TARGET OF THE CAMPAIGN FOR CHRIST'S THROUGH GIFTS RAISED AND PLEDGED.

However, this does not mean the Campaign is over, with a number of milestones yet to be completed – as well as the fact that, as in the last year, much of our fundraising work pivoted towards the fourth pillar of the Campaign, **Enhancing College Life**.

With students being told by the government in January 2021 not to return for Lent term, the beginning of the year was in some ways a disappointing one, with the relative normality of Michaelmas 2020 having so suddenly reverted to student life taking place entirely online. However, it was for this reason that Christ's focussed on making up for this, by putting as many resources into the education and wider experience of our students as possible. Some of this was through large expenditures, such as £44,000 invested into our servers, to reduce the pressure on the College internet – others were small purchases to enhance quality of life, such as £27.99 spent on a pair of blue light glasses to prevent one student's headaches from the online nature of learning.

Alongside this, the College's focus was ensuring that life at Christ's continued as normally as possible. From Fellows making special efforts to arrange face-to-face supervisions, to staff delivering meals to students whilst they had COVID, everyone in the community worked hard to keep the College connected. This even extended to the more social elements of the calendar: Graduands Dinner took place outdoors, including a takeaway option for those who needed it.

In the words of Professor Susan Bayly – *'I've seen many exciting transformations in College life in my 30-plus years as a Tutor and teaching Fellow: we're a community that's always open to the need for change and growth. But what doesn't change at Christ's is our passionate commitment to an ideal of excellence with a human face, and we place that ideal at the heart of everything we do to support and nurture our students.'* This priority lay at the centre of all the support that the College provided over the past year.

KEEPING TRADITIONS ALIVE

At the start of the 2021–22 Academic Year, Christ's faced an unexpected challenge; the scheduling of traditional events for first year undergraduates, but for two years instead of one. Indeed, as each of our students in their second year had missed out on the rituals of beginning their course, from having a Matriculation photograph taken, to signing the Matriculation registers, it was essential to ensure that they were not missing out.

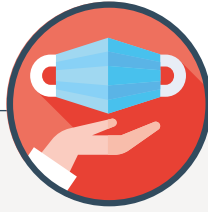
To rectify this, the College worked closely with the JCR and MCR to expand these ceremonies to include the additional year of missed students. For example, Dr Genny Silvanus, College Archivist, and

Revd Dr Bob Evans, College Chaplain, presided over extra sessions in the Old Library to allow students the opportunity to sign their names in the historic College records. Meanwhile, we were able to hold both Freshers' photos on the same day, to ensure the continuation of community memory.

Additionally, other significant events in the College calendar could once again be held in person, such as the annual Admission of Scholars: ninety-four new Scholars were admitted, following the excellent exam results of the Summer, where our students again received more Firsts than at any other College.

STUDENT LIFE IN THE PANDEMIC

Beyond the academic, one of the key elements of a Christ's education is the breadth of extracurricular activities our students can take part in, and we ensured this continued to occur. Whilst the year started with a ban on team sports, due to COVID restrictions, by the time Summer Vacation came along our students had made the most of opportunities to meet over Easter term, holding Cuppers matches alongside casual games to keep teams fit and healthy.

Societies continued to operate as well, thanks in part to the Senior Tutor's Prizes given to any group that ran online activities, but also the imaginative approaches of our students: like the Medical Society putting cake and teabags into all member's pigeonholes in advance of welfare

events. By the time the 2021–22 academic year started, the annual Freshers' Fair was even able to be held in person once more, using the temporary marquees the College had put up in Second Court (after their successful introduction in 2020).

The MCR in particular were extremely passionate in ensuring their members remained in contact, holding a variety of events including: a festive wreath-building workshop; a photography competition open to students across the globe; and visits to sites and museums across Cambridge. As the cross-disciplinary conversations enabled by a thriving MCR are what make studying at Christ's so valuable for students, it was great to see it continue in the form of online quizzes and drop-in sessions, even when it was impossible to meet in person. We are sure that this community spirit will continue, especially as more postgraduate students will be able to live in College with the completion of Yusuf Hamied Court.

CHRIST'S RESEARCH AND STUDY HUB

With construction work well underway on the King Street Development, we are looking towards the final capital project in our current Campaign: the Christ's Research and Study Hub (CRASH for short). Envisioned as a replacement for the 'New Library' that exists in Bath Court, it will also be a complete renovation for this area of College: a glass roof over the quad, an expansion of the Buttery, and the opening of exhibition space for the Old Library. The intention is to make it the central space in College life for students, with green credentials through innovative ground source heating.

It is also designed with the lessons of the pandemic in mind; the need for shared study spaces. COVID highlighted how students learn more, and learn better, through collaborative discussion – be that in person in the College gardens, or through Zoom sessions online. Thus, CRASH's courtyard will have spill over seating from the Buttery, allowing an area for group work to occur, as well as various breakout rooms that have proven so popular in the current Library.

THE GARDENS OF CHRIST'S

OF COURSE, SOME OF THE SUPPORT OF OUR DONORS ALSO GOES TOWARDS THE MAINTENANCE OF THE HISTORIC CHRIST'S DOMUS SITE; KEY AMONGST THESE BEING THE GARDENS AT THE CENTRE OF OUR COURTS, AND THE FELLOWS' GARDEN. THEY ARE A BEAUTIFUL PART OF OUR HERITAGE, BUT ALSO A VITAL SPACE FOR STUDENTS AND STAFF ALIKE, AS PART OF THE SURROUNDINGS FOR THOSE WHO LIVE AND WORK HERE.

Indeed, these spaces have played a key role in the lives of our students since the pandemic began, more than any other time in the history of Christ's. The provision of picnic benches throughout them allowed more work to go on outdoors than ever before, vital for student well-being through socialising with others, and allowing academic collaboration to continue in the depths of Lockdown. Even some supervisions were able to take place outdoors, on sunnier days in Cambridge!

With the College's pledge to reduce carbon-dioxide emissions by 30% by 2030, our Gardening team will be vital as part of this endeavour. From investing in less resource-heavy ways to maintain these spaces, to

taking care of the bees who call the Fellows' Garden home, and even putting together edible displays that grew food for use in the kitchen in the borders, their work falls right alongside our wider initiatives to make Christ's a more environmentally friendly place.

This support was also put towards ensuring students could live and study wherever they felt most comfortable; whether that was in College, with financial support for those who needed to return to Cambridge, or at home, with £1,255.43 in Book Grants given to enable study wherever students were. Students not using their room weren't charged rent for it; and for those that did return, we were able to offer Rent and Top-Up Bursaries to reduce the financial burden of living in student accommodation away from home. This care extended to mental health as well; all students were able to have meetings with counsellors, even if they did not have identified conditions, to ensure they felt connected and supported with tools to prevent loneliness and depression.

Indeed, when interviewing students to take part in our annual Telephone Campaign, when asked what they appreciated most about Christ's, the response was

almost always the same; the way in which they had felt supported by the College throughout the difficulties of the past year. As one of our callers, Mark Barrow (m. 2020), a PhD candidate, put it – *'The College was great at supporting students during lockdown. I was living in a house with 8 other people, which inevitably meant we all got COVID at one time or another. This clearly meant we had to stay in the house, but College staff were only too happy to drop off shopping for us and check to see if we needed anything.'*

Such work was enabled by numerous donations to this initiative throughout the year, including a Legacy of over £705,000 towards bursaries from the estate of Mr Terry Cann, a Lady Margaret Beaufort Fellow of the College, and the funds pledged and given in the 2021 Telephone Campaign. Thank you to everyone who contributed to this, and made it possible for our students to thrive here, despite the circumstances of the world around them.

Scholarships in Action!



The provision of postgraduate funding is not just something that impacts the life of the individual student who receives it, but the wider world through the research that it inspires and enables;

topics that would not be able to be explored without these provisions.

One example of this is Ciara Greaves (m. 2021), who was awarded a Warwick Studentship of £12,064.50 annually to undertake a Geography PhD entitled 'Climate and Societal Impacts of Large Volcanic eruptions'. Her project is investigating the effect short term weather events, specifically the large Icelandic eruptions, have on natural climate

change; this, in turn, will allow new assessments on their future environmental impact. With climate science such a pressing issue, following COP26 in Glasgow, work such as hers will be vital for informing policy at every level; furthered by other College initiatives such as the Kennel Fund for Climate Change.

On the award, Ciara said '*I cannot even begin to express how appreciative I am of this generous donation. Undertaking a PhD has been a dream of mine for a long time, although something I would never have had the financial means to do alone.*' Our thanks go to Mr Jim Warwick and Dr Jane Dominey, whose generosity has enabled this work, and that of many other students who have passed through Christ's.

Providing for Student Hardship

Whilst the Hardship Fund is always vital for our community, this year saw it stretched further than ever to aid our students across the globe, as financial difficulties struck the community, and the College worked hard to aid with this.

In total, over £22,807 was spent in 2021 on Hardship Grants alone; a total that looks to be matched, if not surpassed, by requests for funding in the current year. This support was for unexpected expenditures and does not even count the variety of other financial aid given out in the course of the year.

It is notable that every area of the College community pitched into help, with the JCR choosing to donate £5,500 of their budget back to Christ's for use in the form of Hardship Grants, which were

given out over the course of June and July. Seeing everyone come together, to support the most vulnerable, was truly inspiring to the Tutorial Office who oversaw the process of fund allocation.



SPOTLIGHT ON Access

With government guidance changing so consistently, our Admissions team were stuck between two major impulses: continuing the online work that was successfully reaching more students than ever, and re-opening the College to provide the irreplaceable experience for applicants of visiting Christ's. So, the obvious decision was made, that of blending the two in order to create a hybrid approach to their work, combining the best of both worlds.

Open Days mixed smaller, in-person group visits, with larger online presentations directed at students across the world; and this allowed for a wider range of participants attending. In August and September, weekly in-person tours catered for around 120 individuals to see the College, and ran alongside monthly grounds tour webinars for those that were unable to attend to visit. Meanwhile, the second year of our Bridging Course with King's and Gonville & Caius evolved based on student feedback, becoming a week-long stay in Cambridge, consisting of social and academic sessions, followed by a week of online lectures, seminars, workshops, and supervisions; truly preparing students for the term to come.



All in all, 2021 turned into a year of growth for the Admissions Department, as they were able to apply lessons learned, whilst not losing what made the Access process special at Christ's – the human element that so many students cite as their reason for choosing Christ's.

'I have tried several similar webinars from various other places, but they always failed to give any clarity or insight, whereas I was able to learn so much from today and left feeling much more confident in making good subject choices. Thank you – it was perfect!' – Feedback from attendee to our new 'Subject Matters' Webinar series on A-Level Choices.

Seeing the Impacts of Outreach

2021 saw a major milestone for our Admissions work, with 78% of our 2021–22 UK intake coming from state school backgrounds – trumping the previous academic year's 74%, which had been the highest up to this point. More than this, however, we saw a huge increase in the number of students attending who had previously participated in an event or webinar – over one-quarter indicating they had previously been involved with one of Christ's offerings.
